CLRP Program Overview

Students learn to make decisions through self evaluation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Continued Self Evaluation -Follow daily program schedule (bible studies, ministry assignments, church and fellowship etc.) -12 Step - Power to Choose (Steps 7-12) -Life Skills classes (4hrs) -Financial Stewardship (Dave Ramsey) -1 on 1 Case Management and Counseling -Develop a transition plan for continuing recovery, employment and housing.

1) A student's participation and his response to group and individual study assignments will determine if additional time is needed in each level of the program. Self-evaluation, class attendance, chores, ministry assignments, the 12 Step - Power to Choose and 1-on-1 meetings with program staff will also help to determine each students progress in the program.

2) Completion of each stage is not determined by the amount of time a student has spent in that stage but on how he meets the expectations. Full completion of all three stages is required in order to successfully graduate.
